# **STEINHAUER**

A PHOTOGRAPHIC EXHIBITION OF SELECTED WORKS FROM THE SINGAPORE 'NUMBER BLOCKS' AND HONG KONG 'COCOONS' SERIES

It is my pleasure to introduce the works of Peter Steinhauer with this solo exhibition 'Structure'; presenting his Singapore 'Number Blocks' and Hong Kong 'Cocoons' series.

Steinhauer is a fine-art photographer who captures the very essence of his chosen subject through his attention to the everyday detail. In this instance it is urban architecture and landscape that is so unique yet ubiquitous to each of Singapore and Hong Kong. Not for him are the glitzy and the grand; the reflective glass and metal architectural structures that define most modern skylines of today's world. This would be all too easy and obvious and possibly too common a subject to capture. Steinhauer prefers to beautify a seemingly difficult subject on the eye. The majority of us would not even regard them as photographic or artistic material; buildings which in most of our minds were not meant to be the subject of such attention, let alone the genuine works of art that he has turned them into.

For me, Steinhauer's focus and the resulting imagery is a reminder that we all so often rush about our daily lives, oblivious to our surroundings. Rarely do we take the time to look or listen to what is around us. We are all so busy, engulfed in or consumed by our hectic schedules. His message to me is clear. Take your time to take a moment. Stop, look, listen, breath and feel the presence of what surrounds us.

With his works held in a prestigious selection of museums and private collections, and being the deserved recipient of many international photography awards, REDSEA Gallery is in no doubt that Steinhauer's success will continue to grow and we are delighted and proud to play our part in supporting that.

"I'm not so much a social documentary photographer. I just take pictures of things because I think they look cool." Peter Steinhauer's photographs are both works of silence and works full of life. Since 1993 he has been documenting the many facets of Asian cultures. American-born, Steinhauer focuses on photographing architecture within urban landscape, natural landscape, man made structure and portraits from different countries throughout Asia.

His finely crafted prints are exhibited in galleries and museums internationally, and are in the collections of the Carnegie Museum of Art, The Hong Kong Heritage Museum and a growing number of private and corporate collections worldwide. He is the recipient of numerous international photography awards including finalist for the 2014 Lucie Awards, a Ford Foundation grant for his multi year work in Vietnam, a Black and White Spider Award for Architecture and PX3 Paris awards among others. His 'Cocoons' project was featured in the NY Times LENS and also selected into the 2014 Communication Arts Photography Annual.

Describing himself as a purist from a photography background not a digital artist, Steinhauer turns his striking images into large-scale photographic works, selfprinted using archival pigment inks and the highest-grade Hahnemuhle paper. Pre-visualising the impact of the angle and perspective of his camera lens specifically for creating larger scale works, Steinhauer's resulting images are turned into monumental works that capture the unique essence of the cities he moves through.

Steinhauer's first artist monograph, 'Vietnam: Portraits and Landscapes', was published by Edition Stemmle in 2002. 'Enduring Spirit of Vietnam', his second artist monograph was awarded Best Photography Book of the Year 2007 by Photo District News. Other book projects include 'Hong Kong Cocoons', 'Bali, Asian Markets' and a third on Vietnam.

Born and raised in Boulder, Colorado, Steinhauer developed an early fascination and appreciation of cultures from his parents who brought him and his siblings on annual travels. This experience has led him to live in numerous cities throughout the US, Sweden, Vietnam, Hong Kong and Singapore. In 2014, after 20 years of living in Asia, Steinhauer relocated back to the US where he lives in San Francisco with his wife and three children.

### SINGAPORE NUMBER BLOCKS

"What interested me is that someone took a lot of time to find color schemes and fonts–sometimes scripted or blockish or art deco fonts, some with drop shadow and lots of style–and I was intrigued that they put a lot of effort into all of that."

Early in the year '2000, Steinhauer relocated to Singapore from Vietnam where he had been living and photographing since 1993. It was in his first week, while exploring his new home, that he came across HDB's with these large numbers adorning the outside façades. The enormous numbers made up of creative fonts with scripted, art deco drop shadows, embodied a quirky, funky, odd feel of humor to Steinhauer, yet had an ownership that was uniquely Singaporean, and contemporary as art. The housing blocks were graphical within itself; rows of horizontal balconies, doors and windows, color schemes that were pastel and upbeat. Endlessly catching his eye, interest was ignited, and the first images of his project were made.


In 2011, Steinhauer with his wife and three children moved back to Singapore from Hong Kong where he began to photograph these structures he titled 'Number Blocks'.









## HONG KONG COCOONS

"I saw a giant, 40-story package in the middle of this dense city; it captured my imagination immediately. I kept thinking about the metamorphosis. I thought caterpillars to butterflies and then my wife said, 'cocoon'. It just stuck."

Since 1993, Peter Steinhauer has been documenting the many facets of Asian culture.

Upon his first visit to Hong Kong in January of 1994, arriving at the old Kai Tak International Airport, Steinhauer noticed a very large structure that was caged in bamboo and swathed in yellow material. He was amazed by this monumental structure, standing out beneath a canopy of clouds as it glowed against the monochromatic, urban skyline. Thus began Steinhauer's fascination with these multi-coloured structures.

Once a practice throughout Asia, Hong Kong is the final stronghold of the bamboo scaffolds. The title 'Cocoons' for this body of work was a natural choice. The framework; a metamorphosis; like caterpillars to butterflies. Colored material unveiled ceremoniously reveals a brand new façade, as in a cocoon revealing itself for the first time.







